## **Cloudy Bay Pinot Noir 2004**

**£50.00**

*This iconic estate situated in Marlborough on the south island of New Zealand is perhaps best known for its Sauvignon Blanc, in fact most people think that it's the only grape variety used.*

*The overall star is not the ubiquitous Sauvignon but the Pinot Noir made from premium Marlborough grapes.*

*Pinot Noir thrives in Marlborough where Cloudy Bay has planted the best clones in prime vineyard locations to produce the highest quality fruit. 2004 showed a cool season redeemed by ideal autumn conditions. Enticing aromas of ripe juicy cherries and dark fruitcake are enriched by the plush scent of new leather and hints of toasty oak.*

*The palate is supple and fine with a delicious plummy fruit character layered over charry oak and delicate tannins.*

## **Monte Bello Estate Ridge Monte Bello**

**£140.00**

### **Ridge Lytton Springs**

**£50.00**

*The Monte Bello estate vineyard was planted, and the winery constructed, in 1886. One of the most widely respected Californian wineries, Ridge has a loyal following. Surprisingly, they are one of the few new world producers that have a good reputation among die-hard adherents of old world wines, such is their universal appeal.*

*Deep black current nose with overtones of chocolate and coffee.*

*This puppy needs a bit of air. Great roundness in the mouth and finish, which lasts for a good minute afterwards, real tread. Sweet red fruits, mulberry and dark chocolate. Cohesive palate with dense black fruits and mineals. Integrated fine tannins.*

## **Chateau Lafite-Rothschild 2001**

**£250.00**

*Lafite represents the very best that wine can be.*

*Many records refer to the wines of Lafite including the well-known archives of Thomas Jefferson who frequently purchased this wine for the first president of the United States, George Washington. Lafite is fermented in 27 vats of Bosnian oak and spends between 24-30 months in French oak barriques.*

*The whole process from picking the grape to bottling is strictly supervised by Eric de Rothschild, the present administrator on behalf of the family.*

*At picking time a very severe selection process is carried out and in very abundant vintages as much as half of the crop is eliminated.*

*The quality of chateau Lafite Rothschild needs no introduction..." Whatever the case, all the chateau Lafite wines have an almond and violet aroma!"*

## **Chateau Palmer 2001**

**£140.00**

*A benchmark Bordeaux, named after a British Officer Major General Palmer 1814. 44% Merlot, 51% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5% Petit Verdot. This blending of the 3 varietals has created a rich and subtle vintage, an almost perfect expression of the Palmer style.*

*The 2001 has been amazing ever since it was bottled. This classic Palmer, very representative of its terroir, continues to till out with age.*

*The complex, fruity, floral bouquet has hints of spice, tobacco, and coffee. This wine is full bodied and rich on the palate with an excellent tannic backbone. The elegant aftertaste is soft and rich.*

*This wine has all the characteristics of a great Bordeaux, with superb ageing potential. A seductive, perfumed, quite floral nose; medium-bodied on the palate that eschews flamboyance for precision,*

balance and harmony. Notes of black cherry, pencil-lead and raspberry with a grainy texture and firm tannins.

It is quintessentially Margaux, awesome, show stopping remarkable Palmer is all of these things.

### **Chateau Batailley 2001**

**£75.00**

The name is said to derive from a "bataille" fought 600 years ago between the French and the English on the same spot as the present property. It is located in the south of the commune of Pauillac on the road to St-Laurent.

Chateau Batailley is classified as a 5eme Cru Classe and is one of the best value wines in Pauillac.

"A 5<sup>th</sup> classified growth from Pauillac, for years considered a good value, reliable claret but in recent years elevated to new heights of finesse under the watchful stewardship of its owners, the Casteja family. A bouquet of cassis, tobacco leaf and cedarwood gives way to a mature, soft fruit flavour on the palate. 2001 was a fine, elegant vintage with very precise definition, and all its component parts in excellent harmony." (Alun Griffiths MW)

Drink: 2008-2015.

Jancis score: 17/20.

Parker score: 86/100.

It is quintessential Pauillac with layers of creamy, ripe blackcurrant and plum fruit and hints of mint.

### **Chateau d'Angludet, Cru Bourgeois Margaux 2002**

**£160.00**

Origin: Medoc, Bordeaux, France

Appellation: Margaux

Typical grape composition: Cabernet Sauvignon.

This is of the four wines ever to achieve first growth status in the 1855 Bordeaux classification, 75% Cabernet Sauvignon 20%, Merlot 5% Petit Verdot and Cabernet Franc.

Winemaker Ben Sichel has really come up with the goods. Sweet, "fleshy" well rounded palate with remarkable velvety tannins.

Thomas Jefferson placed it first in his personal classification. The 1855 vintage was ordered by Napoleon.

### **Chateau Haut Brion 2001**

**£100.00**

The chateau itself is a charming, turreted affair, parts of which go back to the sixteenth century. Notably Chateau Haut Brion is the only chateau situated outside the Medoc to have been included in the famous classification of 1855.

Haut-Brion is characterised by its seductive perfume, harmony and elegance and its ability to age with grace and dignity.

"Haut Brion 2001, which was bottled late possesses an unmistakable nobility as well as burgeoning complexity. Plum/purple to the rim, this blend of 52% Merlot, 35% Cabernet Sauvignon, and 12% Cabernet Franc is playing it close to the vest, having closed down considerably after bottling.

Nevertheless, it reveals pure notes of sweet and sour cherries, black currants, liquorice, smoke, and crushed stones. Medium-bodied with excellent purity, firm tannin and an angular, structured finish.

### **Trio Infernal No. 1/3**

**£45.95**

In 2000, Jean Michel Gerin (Cote Rotie) Laurent Combier (Crozes Hermitage) and Peter Fischer founded Trio Infernal having purchased 50 acres in Priorat, Spain.

These wine makers extensive with Rhone varieties has led them to fashion a new style of Priorat neither heavy-nor ponderous, but rich, vibrant and aromatic. These are fabulously concentrated,

wonderfully complex reds, with spicy aromas and great length, like supercharged Chateauneuf-du-Papes.

**2005 Trio Infernal Priorat Cuvee no. 2/3**

**£130.00**

*This silky red offers lavish oak flavours of toast, dark chocolate and spice. The greatest wine that's has been released by Trio, even upstaging the highly acclaimed 2004.*

*100% 90- year-old Carignan that sees 18 months of new French oak. Cuvee no. 2/3 has gorgeous wild raspberry flavours and pronounced violet overtones, but don't drink this wine too fast- it will benefit from hours in a large Riedel glass. This is a serious wine that goes perfectly with aged mountain cheeses or roasted game birds. Drink now-2025.*

*It's a wine that teaches you patience; an empty glass smells different from a full one. Because, while the full one expresses all the dense, brambly blueberry fruit you'd expect from something like a hot California syrah, the empty glass smells of violets, earth, mint, garrigue, thick- skinned red grapes, and luet. The dominant 90-year-old carinena grape ( aged 18 months in new French barrels) evolves into something much more floral—the sweet garden aromatics coating the tongue like the mist of a woman's perfume.*

*Not just a beautiful woman, but one who know she's beautiful and walks right past you.

**Chateau Musar 1999**

**£45.95**

*Chateau Musar was founded in 1930 by Gaston Hochar. Chateau Musar is located in an 18<sup>th</sup> century castle in Ghazir, Lebanon. It is remarkable that this wine still survives in the Beka ravaged by cival war. Chateau Musar 19999 is a blend which may include Cabarnet Sauvignon, Chinsaut, Grenache and Marvedre.*

*This wine has a delicious flavour, wonderful richness and fresh soft tannins. This Musar has a good depth of colour; good spicy fruit as the nose and a full palate. Musar is made in a Bordeaux style and has a cult following around the world.*

**Rockfords Basket Press Shiraz**

**£100.00**

*This black shiraz from the Barosa valley is the sort of wine people dream about. Uniquely Australian, its loaded with rich ripe fruit flavours and very fine tanning- it's a old fashioned red that will put a smile on the faces fall those who are lucky enough to drink it.*

**Penfolds Grange (1999)**

**£250.00**

*(Barossa valley)*

*Named after the original Grange cottage built at Magill by Dr Penfold, this wine was pioneered by Max Schubert- Penfolds chief winemaker in the 1950's. Made from specially selected Shiraz grapes from south Australian vineyards and matured in new American hogheads. This is an iconic wine around the world it is the finest Australia has produced.*
